


**Mission Statement**

The mission of Project I'Famagu'onta is to improve the mental health and daily life function of children with Serious Emotional Disturbances and maintain the child and family system within the home/community setting.

**POPULATION CONTEXT**

Geographically remote island; interconnected villages; connection to culture, warm environment, faith based communities readily available; multi-cultural setting, multi-linguistic society, Low SES status, high unemployment; acculturation issues; limited, available trained professionals; tendency towards traditional interventions, gaps in services and resources.

THROUGH WRAPAROUND PROCESSES, AGENCIES COORDINATE CARE AND SHARE RESOURCES USING TRADITIONAL AND NON-TRADITIONAL SUPPORTS AND SERVICES TO MAINTAIN THE CHILD IN THE HOME/ COMMUNITY.

- **FAMILY-DRIVEN SERVICES:** and supports should consider the needs and strengths of the entire family.
- **INDIVIDUALIZED SERVICES:** Services and supports should be tailored to the needs and strengths of each child and family.
- **CULTURALLY COMPETENT:** Services and supports should be sensitive and responsive to the cultural characteristics of children and their families.
- **LEAST RESTRICTIVE:** Service planning should balance a child and family's need to interact in school and community setting with the most appropriate services and supports.
- **COMMUNITY-BASED:** Services and supports should be provided in the child and family community.
- **ACCESSIBLE:** Access to services and support should not be limited by location, scheduling, or cost.
- **INTERAGENCE:** Core agencies providing services and supports should include mental health, child welfare, juvenile justice and education.
- **COORDINATION/COLLABORATION:** Partner agencies, providers and organizations should provide a seamless system of services and supports for children and their families.

Manage and maintain child in the home/school and community	<b>STRATEGY</b> Implement a range of services to support children with SED and their families which include intensive home-based services, respite, crisis response teams, and programs that strengthen child/family coping, communication and conflict management/resolution skills.  <b>INDICATOR</b> - Increased numbers/ types of enhanced new & accessed services & supports - Reduced number of out-of-home placements - Reduced number of off-island placements - Reduced numbers of run-away behaviors - Reduced numbers in suicidal self-injurious behaviors - Reduced reports of family violence - Reduced numbers w/judicial involvement - Improvement in School performance - Excelling in home/ school/ work objectives

Successful/improved child and family functioning in the home, school and community	<b>STRATEGY</b> Enhance, develop & monitor implementation of a range of accessible and culturally competent services to support children with SED and their families  <b>INDICATOR</b> Implementation of new/expansion of accessible services, crisis response teams, respite services, intensive home-based services and day treatment programs. Trained and active family wrap teams in place. Flex funds established, utilization and accessible to family wrap teams.

Utilization of more trained para-professionals in wraparound plans. Numbers of Improved Family Satisfaction Reports Improved numbers of Family representation and family roles in all forums or activities Types of supports in place to facilitate family involvement

3. Family Service satisfaction	<b>STRATEGY</b> Implement public awareness activities to generate support, involvement and resources.  <b>INDICATOR</b> Numbers of active wraparound family teams and updated plans.

Sustainability	<b>STRATEGY</b> Work w/ youth agencies & policy makers towards resource building/collaboration & accountability.  <b>INDICATOR</b> Numbers of satisfied families /reports of improved child functioning or child/family successes Numbers of families employed and actively involved in the systems of care. Sustainability plan in place and activated Diverse community partnerships supporting SOC Redeployment and diversification of funds/resources to support SOC Interagency structures/policies in place for planning, coordination & leveraging of resources/services.
