<u>Vision</u>: Development of a model promoting resiliency & addressing current challenges in the development of our system of care for youth with serious emotional disabilities & their families, including those with <u>co-occurring substance use disorders</u>.

Mission: Facilitate implementation of a continuum of positive behavior interventions and supports through the delivery of evidence-based services, care management, and individual service plans in targeted schools in North Central Kentucky to address mental health & substance use issues of youth emphasizing evidence-based strategies to identify and treat youth with co-occurring substance use issues.

Target population:

Children and their families

Kentucky resident-8 county area

Age 5-21 years SED (primary)/Birth-5 year (secondary) Youth with SED & co-occurring substance use disorders


- >1 year with limitations in 2+ areas: self-care; family life; interpersonal relations; self-direction; and education and:
 - •Receiving out-of-state treatment for SED, or
 - •Child removed from his/her home and has been unable to maintain the child in a stable setting, or
 - •≥18, meets other criteria & received services for SED prior to age 18

Challenges:

- •Widespread accessibility of drugs/alcohol
- •Youth with SED more susceptible to SU/SA
- •Funding losses for children's mental health services
- •No State Medicaid services for substance use issues
- •Large rural areas / Transportation issues
- •"Resolving door cases" / Service transition gaps
- •Hurdles to collaborative service provision
- Access barriers
- •Criminalization of persons with mental health and substance use issues

Needs:

- •Expand school-based mental health services
- •Local long-term & residential treatment services
- •Group treatment teaching independent living skills and vocational training
- •Community awareness of mental health issues and resources
- •Psychiatrists trained to serve youth with SED
- •Local substance use/abuse prevention and treatment for youth (inpatient & outpatient options)
- •Convenient aftercare for substance use/abuse
- •Parent education/support for substance use/abuse
- •Financial assistance for medications
- •Organized advocacy for regional funding
- •Evaluation data for decision-making and advocacy

- Develop family & youth support networks
- Individualized care planning

- Families & youth involved with evaluation
- 3) Implementation of school-based positive behavior interventions & supports model
- Infrastructure development for school-based activities
- Expanded capacity for implementation of intervention strategies
- 4) Develop Utilization-Focused Evaluation System
- Establish evaluation advisory committee
- Implement national and local evaluations
- Provide ongoing data-based decision-making
- 5) Provide Training & Support for implementing Evidence-Based Practices (EBP)
- Educational/training/technical assistance opportunities
- Continuum of positive behavioral intervention & support services

Individual Outcomes

- •Reduce psychiatric hospitalizations
- •Improvements in behavioral functioning
- •Improvements in family supports
- •Improve school-related outcomes
- •Reduce suspension and expulsion rates
- •Decrease rates of substance use
